

Don Bloom, Juror

In judging these works, especially the photographs, abstract qualities tended to trump content and subject matter.

In superior photographs, John Sandstedt captures monolithic masses in Late Afternoon in Zion Valley. Kristopher Schoenleber, in Pebble Beach, contrasts the texture of stones in the foreground with a panoramic background. In Dune Fence, Tari Pantaleo indicates fascinating patterns sweeping across the scene. In Gerry Feldman's Refineries: Kill Van Kull, abstract qualities win out. Bryce Before the Storm, by Valerie Williams, was chosen for it's unusual shape and abstract qualities. Robin Brown's Watering Hole combines an atmospheric sky with landscape and seascape elements. In Steven Wojtowicz's The Beauty Above, an unusual view of tree forms leads to a strong abstract concept. The Ben, a photo by Joan Wheeler, introduces cityscape elements in short supply in this exhibit. Guidance, a photo by Louise Reeves, has that abstract quality for which I look. Avelene Jacobs' Manhattan Sunset dramatizes a familiar scene with a ball of file. Sunrise Over *Dingle*, by Joseph Gilchrist, relates the artist to his Irish roots. Juanell Boyd's *Feeding the Nation* has an admirable austerity. Atlantic City Seascape, by Lynda Woods Cleary, deals with massive sky and sea forms. Richard Cleary's Ringoes emphasizes converging perspective lines. Jerry Spielman's photo, Hightstown Dam, deals masterfully with the drama of nature's crashing forces. Michael Derer, in Light, air, water, recalls Monet's impressionist masterpieces. Mary Allesio Leck, in Disappearing N.J. Landscape, uses perspective to create dynamic diagonal movement. In Ennis at Sunset, the element of cityscape makes a welcome return.

Vadim Levin, in the oil Spring Sunset, again brings to mind Monet, especially his "Japanese bridge" series. Waves, an oil by Lakshmi Durga, has an appealing freshness. Jere Tannenbaum, in Above Ortesi, Italy recalls Marsden Hartley, but creates powerful, massive forms. Nancy Scott, master of collage and mixed media, shows Vista, packed with her signature variety of forms. In Tuscan Landscape, Andrea Orlando shows a row of cypresses in a fresh manner. Consistent prizewinner Stephanie Barbetti, in On the Road to Somewhere and She's a Dream Maker, taps her fertile imagination for these satisfying works. Anjana Babu Thulasi Bai's acrylic Snake Boat Race emphasizes a massive abstract form with an ethereal background. Adrian Nicoara, in Manhattan at Sunset, exploits the beauties of sky and cityscape. In Chinese Fishing Nets by Sajish Ramakrishnan, an abstract pincer-movement is created. For Sadi Mizrahi, in Florence Roofs, cityscape in the major element. In Lynn Cheng Varga's Taiwan's Mountains, monolithic abstract forms play a powerful role. In Roadside in the Pine Barrens, by Barbara Hochberg, a large abstract form dominates. Doors of Portugal, by Bonnie Buccoleri, transcends choice of media to present a fascinating variety of related subjects. Ed. Belding's latex on wood *Closer to Heaven* has those massive forms for which I look. Streets of Sorrow, by Carole Grand, shows a rundown street, suggesting neglect and sadness.




