From rock formations and mountains to the sky and to outer space, this exhibit includes both literal and emotional interpretations of Geology, Meteorology, and Astronomy.

Pugh's sculpture, *Primordial Light*, combines stained glass, mica, crystals and agates to give us a beautiful representation of geological structures while Leck's photograph *Tide Pool with Jointed Rock* shows a close up of an incredible formation of rocks in a tide pool in Tasmania. Schulman's *Water vs Stone* is yet another interpretation of the beauty of rocks and water in the form of an acrylic painting, while Hochberg uses watercolor to show a delicate pattern of lichen on rocks in *Lichen on Granite*. And rocks in the form of buildings are depicted in two other works: Nicora's ceramic tile *Greek Island Santorini* and Choudhury's watercolor *Mughal Ruins*.

Stunning images of mountains and ice are captured in the photographs *Endicott Arm Fjord* and *Calving Glacier* (Levine), and *Grey Glacier Patagonia* (Mizrahi). The beauty of sunlit terra cotta rock against a bright blue sky is shown in another series of photographs: Wood's *Shoreline at Seahouses*, Sandstadt's *View through Broken Arch*, and Wheeler's *Painted Desert*. This same

color combination is also beautifully depicted in Orlando's watercolor *Mesa Arch*. And Sandstadt offers a unique and dramatic view of sand falling in a slot canyon in his photograph *Sand Fall*.

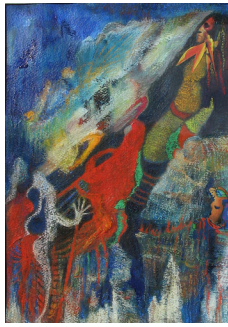
The power of storms is dramatically displayed in two photographs Demier's *Angry Sky over Quarry* and in Michalk's *River's Edge*, and in two paintings: Prashad's watercolor *Snow Storm* and Belding's *The Watch Tower*. In contrast, there is a calm feeling in Gilchrist's photograph *Through the Storm*, in Yang's exquisite watercolor *Misty Peaks* and in the stillness of a tree reflected in water in William's photograph *Wavy Branch*. In *Rainy Night in New Jersey* (Feldman) the raindrops and reflections of lights in glass create a beautiful abstract pattern which captures the feeling of driving on a rainy night.

The vastness of the sky can make us feel small. This concept is shown beautifully in Meadow's two acrylic paintings *Alone* and *Far Away* and in Schoenleber's two stunning photographs *I Alone* and *Star Search*. The beauty and colors of *Northern Lights* is captured in Siddiqi's acrylic painting and Varga's lovely watercolor.

But what's it like beyond the sky? Light's watercolor *Mystery Sky*, shows the wonder of outer space and Barbetti's mixed media *Celestial Beings* captures a feeling of floating through space. Levine's acrylic painting *Big Bang* takes us inside the mystery while Levin's oil *Energy of Two* and Scott's collage *Guardian Cat* remind us of our emotional connection with the universe and with each other.

Finally Young's *1,000 Beautiful Things* presents a collage of photographs which includes all aspects of the theme.

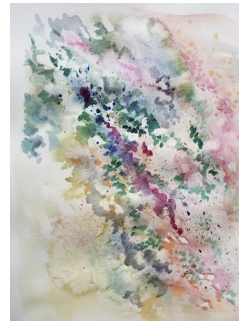

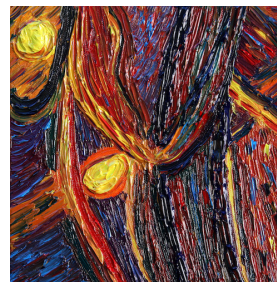

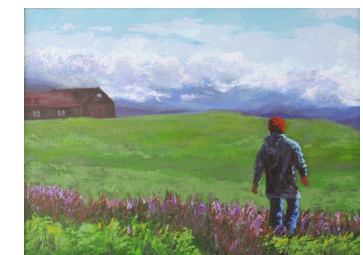
