

In this exhibit FAVORITE PLACES are found all over the world, from settings that are small and personal to majestic vistas that overwhelm us. There is a preference for images of Nature, in both photography and painting. The more intimate pictures tend to be painted, while photography lends itself to grand compositions.

Sweeping views of landscape across the earth seem to cry out to be photographed. Their complexity reveals layers of interlocking forms that seem endless, and are beautiful to contemplate. Catskill Creek (Levine), Cradle Mountain, Tasmania (Leck), Reflecting Everything (Schoenleber), Sabino Canyon (Wheeler).

Nature is all about geometry and chance, where patterns constantly form and dissolve. Whether tamed or wild, the mixture of color, shape, and texture is always surprising and satisfying. Carpet of Tulips (Boyd), Pool, Plainsboro Preserve (Leck), The Place of my Dreams (Lu Zhang).

In some pictures the artist gives us a glimpse of a place through selection, distortion, and rearrangement. The location is unclear but the details give a sense of what captured the

artist's attention. South Florida (Scott), Alleluia Series ll (Barbetti), Walking Yellowstone Prismatic Pool (Sayre), Crooked Reflection (Despande).

The built environment always expresses our cultures and values. Whether it is on a grand scale, or intimate and close, or consists of an accumulation of forms and signs in a city, it tells us something about ourselves and about those who built it. Oranmore Castle Fireplace (Pollard), Canterbury Cathedral (Sayre), New Orleans (Cleary).

These paintings and drawings give diverse landscapes a sense of immediacy, the feeling of being there. They reflect a personal experience of the elements of nature that is transmitted through brush and pencil. Kapalua Bay (Budhu), Spanish Moss Delight (Phillips), West Quoddy State Park (Tannenbaum), Conditions Off Westport (Gowen), Shore at South Bristol, Maine (Prashad), Autumn Woods (Proulx).

There is a feeling of intimacy and privacy in these paintings and photographs. Their emotional power comes from using the art materials to reveal a sincere engagement with the subject. Girl in the Garden (Belding), At the Window (Pantaleo), Junks Sailing on Halong Bay (Rubano), Spring Has Arrived Again (Levin), L'Chiam (DeVico), Prickly Pear (Wheeler), Backyard Tree Fantasy (Schulman).

The relationship between nature and the built environment is so complex and provocative, it can make us look twice at something we know well. Here images are layered and intertwined to give a new perception of both realms. Hagia Sofia, Istanbul (Mizrahi), The Quiet (Brown), Morris Canal Park (Feldman), Approaching the Panama Canal (Jacobs).

A dramatic point of view gives these pictures a special intensity and power. The artist's reactions are present in the colors, textures, and compositions they have chosen to portray these landscapes. Turda Gorge, Romania (Nicoara), Hawaii Grand Canyon (Yee Leung), Hudson Valley (Loia), Heron at the Locks (Sisko).


